*September 2010 Parish Magazine: The Rector writes:-*

The new pattern will start on **Sunday 3 October** – our Harvest Festival – and will comprise the addition of a contemporary, informal service every Sunday. Based on the experience of Easter Day this year, the new service will be at 9.30am and a Parish Communion with organ and hymns will be at 11.15am. This will give time for coffee in the Church Hall between the services during which both congregations can mix and mingle – those who have just attended a service and those arriving before the next.

This is an exciting and long-awaited development in the worshipping life of the Parish Church. I hope and pray that you will not only keep the planning and development work involved in your prayers, but also support the new pattern in whatever way you can. As a church, we are committed to “growing disciples of Jesus Christ” and we trust that this initiative will provide another avenue through which those who have yet to hear the Good News may experience the joy of being part of our church family.
